CRIMESTOPPERS Anonymous—Online Form

What information do we want? There are times when you might not feel comfortable about passing on what you know to the police or other authorities. That's why Crimestoppers exists – to provide you with an anonymous route to give information about crime.

Some of the things you might want to tell us about are:

Murders (including ones that happened a while ago) ~ People who grow, manufacture or sell drugs ~ Youth crime ~ Gang or other organised criminal activity ~ Family violence and sexual crimes ~ Violence against women, children and the elderly ~ Abductions ~ Serious assaults and violence ~ Illegal weapons ~ Robberies ~ Thefts of vehicles and from vehicles ~ Scrap metal theft ~ Illegal gambling ~ Burglary and receiving of stolen property ~ Stock theft ~ Fraud ~ Arson ~ People wanted by the police ~ Serious traffic offending like repeated drunk or drugged driving ~ Illegal activity at work ~ Immigration crime, such as people smuggling or human trafficking ~ Underage prostitution ~ Criminal misuse of identities ~ Criminal misuse of computers ~ Something that could affect New Zealand's national security ~ Environmental crime like fish poaching or illegal dumping of waste ~ Someone who is doing graffiti, tagging or other property damage ~ anything else you don't want to speak to the police or other authorities about directly

NZ Police - Stolen Vehicle Search – www.police.govt.nz/stolen/vehicles Abandoned/Unknown Parked Vehicle On Your Street...

First check if the vehicle is stolen or not via <http://www.police.govt.nz/stolen/vehicles>

If the vehicle IS stolen call your local Police Station (839 0600) and ask for the Crime Reporting Line to Report this to the Police.

If the vehicle is abandoned/Illegally parked/does not display a current warrant/registration you can call Auckland Council on 301 01 01, remember to get a reference number in case you need to call back.

If a vehicle is parked legally and has a current warrant and registration it will not be a Police or Council matter.

NZ Police Crime Reporting Line

If you have been the victim of crime and the offender is not present you can now call the Crime Reporting Line, they will collect the required information and will forward the report to the appropriate police departments for action. (Assault reports need to be done at a Police Station)

You will receive a file number which you can then use for insurance purposes etc, this new streamlined approach will also allow for enhanced Intel gathering which will then let the Police know where and when crime is happening.

Identifying where directive patrolling is needed, targeting known offenders for specific areas and encouraging the public to be the eyes and ears in the areas where there are hot spots.

Please call Henderson Police Station on (09) 839 0600 (or your local Police Station) and ask for the Crime Reporting Line.

Operation SNAP

The Serial Number Action Project (Operation SNAP) provides you with a simple, effective way to help fight crime.

The latest phase of Operation SNAP - launched at the end of April - enables anyone to record serial

numbers and other unique identifying details of their valuable goods on an electronic database.

Operation SNAP is a community partnership designed to reduce property offending and deter property theft.

Consumer Affairs - Be Aware of Different Types of Scams

CONSTANTLY CHANGING – Scammers are constantly coming up with new ways to scam. It's their day job. It could be taking money for goods that don't exist or tricking you into giving them access to your PC. There are countless ways scammers may try to draw you in.

TELL TALE SIGNS – The good news is you're less likely to fall for a scam if you can spot some of the usual signs. Most scams follow basic patterns. This section lists the hallmarks of different types of scams.

DO YOUR HOMEWORK – You have less chance of being scammed if you do some research before handing over your cash. Do an online search of the company or person's name with the word 'scam' after it. It may bring up stories of other people who have experienced the same scam.
